

Drug Treatment Court




- Productive Meetings with Chief Magistrate

 - Bahamas Drug Treatment Court Act & Regulations are being drafted using the Jamaica Model which got high marks from CICAD
 - An MOU between The Bahamas and OAS to get funding for training court personnel

Hosting CICAD's 60th Session



- The Bahamas has to prepare a Diplomatic Note which must be received by the Secretariat by September 2015.
- A MOU must be signed which provides details of all the logistics involved in planning the event.
 - Vice Chair position must be secured by the Minister of National Security or his Designee at the 58th Regular Session scheduled for Lima, Peru in November 2015. This involves consensus by member states.

UNGASS 2016



- UN General Assembly will hold a Special Session (UNGASS) on drugs in April, 2016.
- Important milestone in achieving the goals set in the policy document of 2009
 "Political Declaration and Plan of Action on International Cooperation towards an Integrated and Balanced Strategy to Counter the World Drug Problem", which defined action to be taken by Member States as well as goals to be achieved by 2019.
